APPLYING FOR ONTARIO WORKS:

Anyone who wishes to apply for assistance under the Act is to be given the opportunity to make an application and have their application reviewed.

An application is made for a benefit unit which includes the applicant, his/her spouse and any dependents.

An application for assistance is made in the geographic area where the applicant ordinarily resides.

An in-person intake appointment is necessary to complete the application process.

You will be asked to bring the following each and every time you make an application to Ontario Works:

- -Birth Certificates: for all (you, spouse, children)
- -Status Cards
- -Health Cards
- -Social Insurance Numbers (S.I.N.)
- -Shelter Costs (Rent receipts/agreements, mortgage, heat/hydro/utilities receipts, fire insurance policy, etc.)
- -Asset Details (for self, spouse, and dependent children: up to date bank books/statements for the past 12 months, vehicle ownership/insurance, life insurance policies, inheritance, any other assets, etc.)
- -Confirmation of school attendance
- -Residency/address information (anywhere you have lived for the past 12 months)
- -Employment Information for the past 12 months (R.O.E., pay stubs, etc.)
- -Information on other Earnings (E.I., wages, NCB, etc.)
- -Verification of Status in Canada (for self, spouse, dependent children.




