## **Policy Statement**

The Board acknowledges that students may need additional time to complete their secondary education. Secondary students who are 19 years and up to 21 years of age and have been unsuccessful in completing their OSSD, will be placed in the Learning to 21 Program.

## Regulation

- 1. This policy shall apply to secondary students aged 19 to 21 years of age. A student may remain in secondary school up to the semester that he/she turns 21 years of age.
- 2. Secondary Students in the Learning to 21 Program must meet with the Board of Trustees, prior to the first day of school, to discuss enrolment in secondary school.
- 3. Students in the Learning to 21 Program are required to attend each class on a regular daily basis.
- 4. Students in the Learning to 21 Program are expected to be a responsible, accountable student and take ownership for education by putting forth a sincere effort and attitude toward the school, teachers, staff and other students.
- 5. Students in the Learning to 21 Program will have a probationary period of four (4) weeks to show commitment and effort in obtaining an education. This must be demonstrated in the students' attendance and academic grades. Upon completion of the probationary period, the student will continue to comply with the above conditions.
- 6. Failure to comply with the above conditions will result in a student withdrawal.
- 7. The Learning to 21 Program EAP must be completed signed by the student, Education Counsellor and Principal/Vice-Principal.
- 8. If the student refuses to sign the Learning to 21 Program form, the student will not be enrolled in secondary school.
